2.1 Organisation

- Develop links with schools around the world.
- Promote communication with children in other localities, using ICT in meaningful contexts to develop communication skills.
- Raise awareness and appreciation of other environments and what is happening around the world.
- Develop whole school cross-curricular activities with an international theme

2.2 The Curriculum

- Integrating the international dimension into the whole curriculum by raising awareness of appropriate curriculum links
- Developing an awareness of and celebrating the similarities and differences in lifestyle, religion and culture in a range of other countries
- Enabling all pupils to take part in international activities
- Developing attitudes to common issues of interest and concern to children
- Involving the school community in a wide range of contacts with other countries
- Developing different ways of communicating with other countries and taking advantage of ICT
- Developing opportunities to challenge stereotypes, prejudices and xenophobic attitudes
