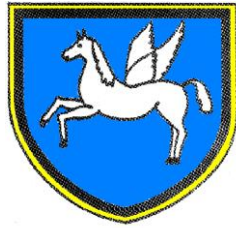

## History Intent Document

### Intent

Our intention as a school is to deliver a broad history curriculum through the following means:

- Enable pupils to develop their capabilities and understanding required for future historical studies.
- Ensure that children will have a good understanding of the overall chronology of both British and world history.
- Recognise the approximate time span that each individual topic covers.
- Foster and develop a curiosity to historical events.
- Challenge the misconception that history is not relevant in this modern, technological age.

### Implementation

At Winchelsea we follow the history programs of study outlined in the National Curriculum 2014 (updated) document. As class teachers we:

- Present a rich and diverse account of British and world history.
- Create opportunities for meaningful cross-curricular links.
- Provide a range of immersive lesson ideas.
- Attempt to make links to our local area wherever possible.
- Aim to utilize external organisations for field trips or visits into our school.

### Impact

- Delivery of history at Winchelsea is engaging. This is evident by the children's enthusiasm: they are always keen to find out what their next topic will be, with high levels of participation with their optional topic-based homework.
- Children have a good understanding of the overall chronology of both British and world history.
- Children are curious and critical historians who can analyse sources, understand cause and effect, evaluate the significance of events and identify similarities and differences.
- Effective progression of knowledge and skills are illustrated in pupils' portfolios and wonderful display work. This is also evident in how we share our achievements via Twitter and when we invite parents in for an 'Express' event.
