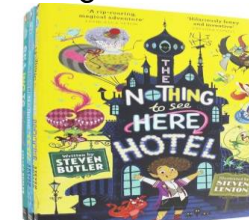
This half term our design and technology will look at structures. We will investigate and then follow a set of instructions with the aim of building a castle.
